GOD'S COMMANDMENTS & THE FIRST COMMANDMENT Lesson Overview:



Today we discussed the Ten Commandments and why God gives us commandments. The Ten Commandments were given to Moses when he led Israel out of slavery from Egypt during the Exodus. God instructed His people Israel how they should live in order to be happy and in relationship with Him. Here are the Ten Commandments:

- 1. I am the Lord your God, and you shall have no strange gods before me.
- 2. Do not take the Lord's name in vain.
- 3. Keep the Sabbath day holy.
- 4. Honor your father and mother
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness (lie).
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

We looked at how all the Commandments can be divided into love of God (1-3) and love of neighbor

(4-10). We also began a part of the lesson called Commandment Connection where we go through one or two commandments in detail. This week we looked at the first commandment and how it teaches us to love God above all things so that we can be happy with Him.

REVIEW WITH YOUR CHILD

- 1. What are the two groups into which we can place the commandments? Love of God and love of neighbor.
- 2. What does the first commandment say? I am the Lord your God. You shall not have other gods before me.
- 3. What are we supposed to do under the first commandment? **To put God above all and not idolize other people and things.**
